Today we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord**. In the days following His resurrection until the Ascension, Jesus appeared to His apostles in several different ways to affirm for them that He had been raised from the dead and truly lives. They were filled with the theological virtue of faith, indicating that with God all things are possible. Soon He would leave them again, this time to sit at His Father's Right Hand.

The **Feast of the Ascension** is the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, which commemorates the Ascension of Christ into heaven, according to Mark 16:19, Luke 24:51, and Acts 1:2.

In the Eastern Church this feast was known as *analepsis*, "the taking up", and also as the *episozomene*, the salvation, denoting that by ascending into His glory, Christ completed the work of our redemption.

The terms used in the West, *ascensio* occasionally, *ascensa*, signify that Christ was raised up by His own powers. Tradition designates Mount Olivet near Bethany as the place where Christ left the earth.

Read a few excerpts from <u>a beautiful sermon</u> on the Ascension of Jesus from around the beginning of the fifth century, composed by early church father and bishop <u>St. Augustine of Hippo</u>. *(Source: <u>Vatican Archives</u>)*

St. Augustine first points us to reflect on the Ascension with the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Colossians (Col. 3:1-4): *Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. Listen to the words of the Apostle: If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God; seek the things that are above, not the things that are on earth.* For *just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies.*

He eloquently explains to us how, through his resurrection and ascension, Christ is here with us on earth by His divinity, and we are in Heaven with Him by His love,

While in heaven he is also with us; and we while on earth are with him.

He is here with us by his divinity, his power and his love. We cannot be in

heaven, as he is on earth, by divinity, but in him, we can be there by love.

And how His Ascension is unique to Him alone: No one ascended into

heaven except Christ because we also are Christ: he is the Son of Man by

his union with us, and we by our union with him are sons of God. Thus, no

one but Christ descended and no one but Christ ascended; not because

there is no distinction between the head and the body, but because the

body as a unity cannot be separated from the head.
